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WAKE COUNTY SMARTSTART RELEASES ANNUAL REPORT

RALEIGH, NC – **How do we build a promising future for Wake County? By investing in children now**. Research continues to underscore the value of quality early care and education in helping prepare young children for success in school and in life. Wake County SmartStart (WCSS) is proud to highlight its role in supporting young children with the release of their 2012-2013 Annual Report: (link here)

WCSS is a convener and collaborator in Wake County with the goal of success for all young children. Every three years Wake County SmartStart assesses community needs, calls for proposals from local agencies and non-profits that can serve those needs, then funds and monitors the work. WCSS funded 16 community programs at nine partner agencies – infusing nearly 18 million into our local economy. Here are some of the highlights of the Annual Report for FY 2012-2013:

- There were 19,289 children, birth to five in regulated child care in FY 2012-2013. Over 14,500 young children attended centers that benefited from WCSS programs, representing 75% of all the children birth to five in child care.
- In 2001, less than 25% of children in the county were attending child care programs with a 4 or 5 star rating. Now that figure is up to 72%. WCSS has played a major role in increasing quality of child care for young children.
- More children, birth to age two, are getting needed services earlier. In 2001, only 1% of young children birth to two
 received early intervention support. That figure has increased to 6%.
- An important reason more young children are reached at a younger age? Home visiting programs. WCSS provided funding for 5,800 home visits in FY 2012-2013. These visits included parent education, assessments and referrals when needed.
- Over 1,200 four-year-olds attended a high quality preschool through the NC Pre-Kindergarten program. In the words of one kindergarten teacher:

"Students in my Kindergarten class who have been in NC Pre-K are some of the highest scoring children in class! What a beneficial program"
