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Wake County SmartStart Announces New Program for Parents in the Works

RALEIGH, N.C. – Finding the right service for a child in need can be a daunting task. Parents can look forward to a less stressful road ahead in navigating home-based services. Wake County SmartStart received a three-year grant of \$295,496 from the John Rex Endowment to create a coordinated system ensuring that home visiting services are easily accessible, and better utilized by the community.

The new program is called Wake Connections: Partnerships to Support Young Children at Home

Funding will be used to coordinate home visiting programs in the county that serve children birth to 5; matching existing services and programs to those in need. It is expected to complement the model for coordination of services created by Wake County SmartStart for the NC Pre-Kindergarten single application process.

Additionally, the initiative will provide support for parents and other agencies wishing to make referrals or seeking guidance. A goal of the program is to simplify access to services for families of young children in Wake County.
