eggs, eggplant, green onions, hot peppers, kale, kohlrabi, leeks, lemon balm, lettuce, melons, mustard greens, okra, onions, oregano, parsley, parsnips, peas, potatoes, radishes, rosemary, sage, salad greens, salad mix, spinach, sweet potatoes, tomatoes, and watermelon.
